Introduction

My name is Matthew Taranto, and I have the best fans in the world. For you see, the very book you hold in your hands is the result of hundreds of fans' support, faith, and enthusiasm for a silly online comic series I draw called "Brawl in the Family."



About Brawl in the Family



If you ask me, Nintendo's been the greatest game developer for decades. I was born in 1985, so I grew up right along with the NES and SNES, with Mario, Link, Samus, and Kirby (of course!), and as a kid, I drew Nintendo characters all the time. I absolutely loved--and still love--the fantastic worlds presented in games like *Super Mario Bros.*, *Link's Awakening*, *Super Metroid*, *EarthBound*, etc. So the transition from doodling scenes of Mario hitting blocks to Mario hitting blocks with upside-down question marks on them that sprout sombrero-wearing mushrooms was a natural one.



BitF was a bit of a happy accident; the very first strips were simple doodles of cornball Kirby jokes I thought up on a whim during an art history class in college. They were all sketched on a single piece of printer paper (I carried around several for drawing purposes since the lines on looseleaf bugged me), and basically sat in my binder for months. But in February of 2008, while bored one evening, I decided to quickly sketch them up in Photoshop and post them in a thread on a video game message board I frequented at the time--IGN. I expected to get a few half-hearted chuckles and everyone would move on with their lives, but the positive response there convinced me to make more strips over the next several days. I shot the comics over to the Wii boards on GameFAQs (another popular gaming site) where they were met with even more enthusiasm.



Long story short, I was convinced to start a site and to continue updating regularly. So from April 2008, BitF has been running and continually evolving from a strip about Kirby gags to a full-on celebration of all things Nintendo. I do enjoy a lot of video game webcomics, but I feel that there weren't really enough that were completely focused on the worlds and characters of Nintendo, so that's been one of my goals with BitF; to make it a massive dedication to the company that got me into video games!



About this book



A book of BitF comics was something I wanted to do for awhile, but since making a book is an ambitious and expensive endeavor, the opportunity only became available this summer. Brawl in the Family: Volume One began life as a project on Kickstarter--a site where fans can pledge money in exchange for rewards to help projects come to life. The amount I wanted to raise for the book's creation was \$10,000...and it reached that goal in a single day. So for the remainder of the project's duration, the pledges kept coming in, ending at over \$50,000! The response was completely overwhelming, and it was amazing to see so many fans' support for BitF. So I vowed to make the book as good as possible, cramming it with lots of fun extras and original art.



Inside these hallowed pages, you'll find the first 200 BitF comics in their original glory! See where the madness all began as Kirby transforms into everything under the sun! Relive the magic of Dedede discovering the true meaning of Christmas! Fall in love all over again as Meta Knight finds himself unable to tear himself from Dedede by means of a sticky explosive! Recoil in horror when Waluigi takes over the strip on two separate occasions! And of course, light a candle for the Goombas that were crushed beneath your feet.



The party's just getting started, too--I feel that since the comics are already online, the book should contain lots of extra-special new stuff for the fans! So check out "An Insatiable Appetite," a new ten-page story/poem involving one hungry Kirby, the new Characters pages detailing the 12 most prominent BitF characters of the first 200 strips, a gallery of bonus images from the comic's history (including the very first doodles in class!), a featurette on the process I go through when making a strip, a lovely two-page spread with every *Super Smash Bros. Brawl* character, a Character Index that easily lets viewers find comics with their favorite characters, and of course, a six-page special thanks to the fans that helped make this book possible.

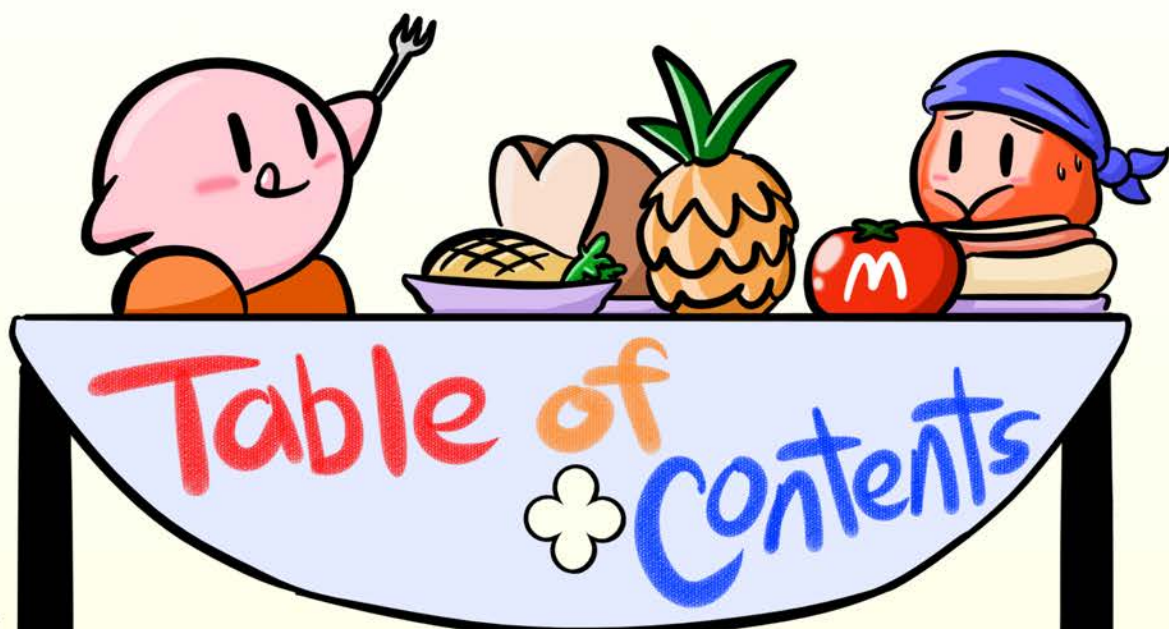

KIRBY



Kirby's childlike optimism is matched only by his insatiable appetite. In most situations, the pink puffball is not only unfazed by negativity, he usually seems completely oblivious to it. While his joyous nature affords him many friends, he's not above eating them.

The early strips of BitF were nearly all Kirby-centric. While I enjoy the simplicity of these comics, I feel BitF couldn't really grow unless I expanded it to more characters and worlds. The eating gags became less common, but Kirby still remains the comic's main character. Nowadays, much of the humor based around Kirby stems from his friendliness and cheerful disposition more than his gluttony.

★ KING DEDEDE



Prideful, boastful, and always looking for a fight, the hotheaded King Dedede can't stand Kirby's ever-cheerful disposition. While the plump penguin usually attempts to "get" Kirby through various means, he does on occasion show a shred or two of humanity. Meta Knight is who Dedede considers his closest friend (although this is mostly one-sided), but he gets along with Adeleine as well.

King Dedede's aggressive personality makes him a lot of fun to write, and he's actually my favorite BitF character. The comic's cast is--for the most part--fairly passive, so most of the snarkier moments are saved for Dedede. His expressions--a combination of pliable fishy lips and Simpson-esque eyeballs--are also consistently fun to explore.

META KNIGHT



The mysterious, masked Meta Knight prefers to be left alone, but he often ends up dragged into all sorts of situations thanks to his livelier colleagues. He has displayed some aggressive tendencies, but they're usually kept in check unless someone gets on his bad side. At his core, Meta Knight is actually fairly heroic, but while he has a strong sense of justice, he is not quick to forgive.

Meta Knight is sort of the "straight man" of BitF, with humor derived from him being forced into scenarios against his will. Kirby fears the masked knight, while Dedede looks up to him and Adeleine always attempts to bring out his good side.



ADELEINE



The only human on Popstar (more or less), Adeleine's friendly disposition and ability to see the good in people allows her to be close friends with Kirby and even Dedede. She also has the strange talent of bringing the subjects of her paintings into the real world, although she's more likely to just keep them as a still life these days.

Adeleine is fun to write for because she's so straightforward and pleasant, and seeing how her earnestness affects the grouchy Dedede (and morose Meta Knight) is always enjoyable to explore. She's become a rather popular character in the comic, despite not actually being a major character in the video games.

MARIO



It's-a him! Mario is well-known throughout the world, and he's always willing to lend a helping hand. It seems like he's always on the road, but that's because his dedication to Princess Peach truly knows no bounds.



Mario's strips are very frequent in BitF, second only to the Kirby ones. They're good go-to comics because everyone's familiar with the Mario games, and the bizarre rules in his world make for lots of comic material.



BOWSER

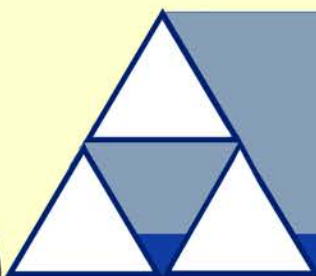


Perhaps the only thing that matches Mario's need to rescue Peach is Bowser's need to kidnap her. The Koopa King is brash and menacing, but usually finds time to race go-karts with his nemesis.



Like Mario, Bowser's comics are less about him so much as the general strangeness of the Mushroom Kingdom. There was one story in BitF history when he was wildly successful...but that's for the next book!





LINK

Whether he's sixteen or cel-shaded, Link is your standard hero on a quest. He has a habit of hanging around characters that tend to do the talking for both of them.

Since Link is silent in all of his games, I've decided to make him silent in BitF as well. Sometimes this can make for some tricky comic writing, but I can often use Navi to speak for him, and Link's expressions are typically enough to get the point across.



WADDLE DEE



Let's hear it for the loyal workers out there! The standard Waddle Dee model comes complete with a hard-working spirit and is 100% loyal (exceptions may apply if they're serving a big jerk).

This particular Waddle Dee dons a bandana, and serves as Dedede's stooge--and occasionally, his pal. He's quite devoted to his king, but contrary to common belief, he does have a breaking point.



JIGGLYPUFF



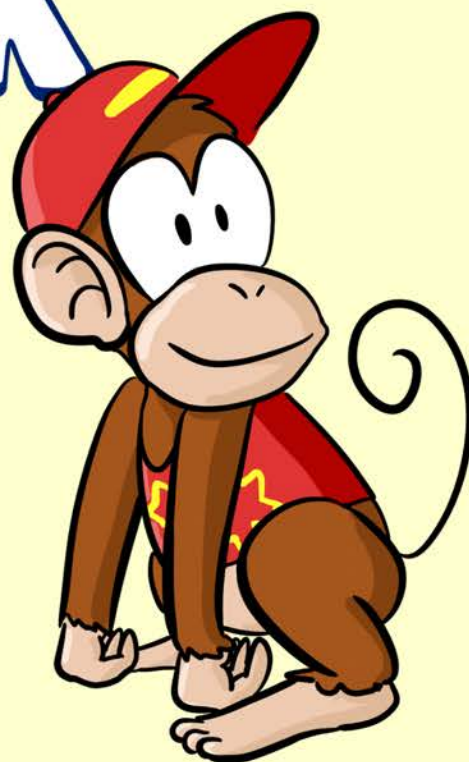
This puffy Pokémon shows up early and quickly becomes Kirby's special pal. The flower so prominently displayed near the ear is a remnant of their first meeting (and strangely, is still alive).



Jigglypuff is another character that doesn't say much, but has plenty of affection to give. Sometimes when I think BitF is getting too negative, I bust out a Kirby and Jigglypuff comic.



DIDDY KONG OK



Diddy and Kirby have a lot in common, personality-wise, so they hang out from time to time. The little monkey is wide-eyed and excitable, although he apparently makes a decent lawyer. ...I think?



Diddy showed up in the earlier strips often, but I think he wasn't seen as much later as Kirby mainly interacted with Dedede, Adeleine, and Jigglypuff. It's nice for Kirby to have a pal similar to him though.





CAPTAIN FALCON

He's loud, he's proud, and he loves to punch. Captain Douglas Jebediah Falcon apparently can't resist letting the world know of his actions, but behind the flashiness is a man with a bit of a crush on a fellow bounty hunter.

Captain Falcon's comics are quite popular with fans, and they all contain his name for easy recognizability. He's one of the most fun characters to write for and draw.



WALUIGI

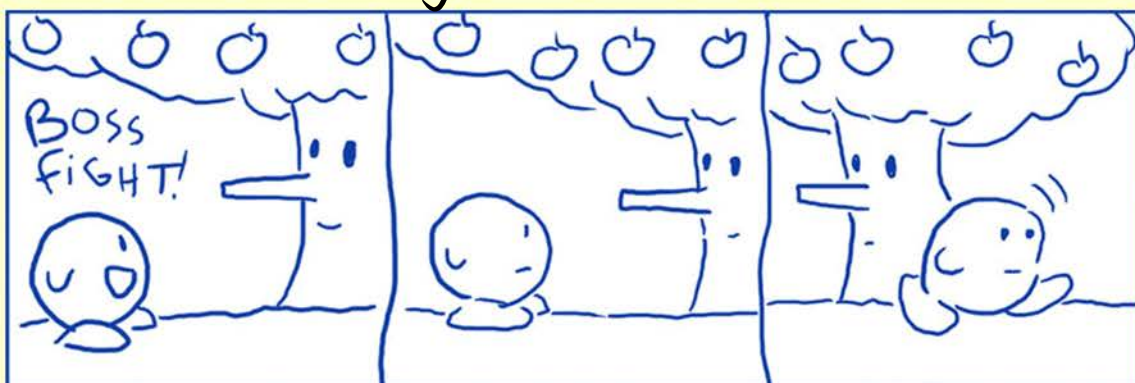
This first comic is still one of my favorites--it's silly and vaguely nonsensical, but makes just enough sense to work.

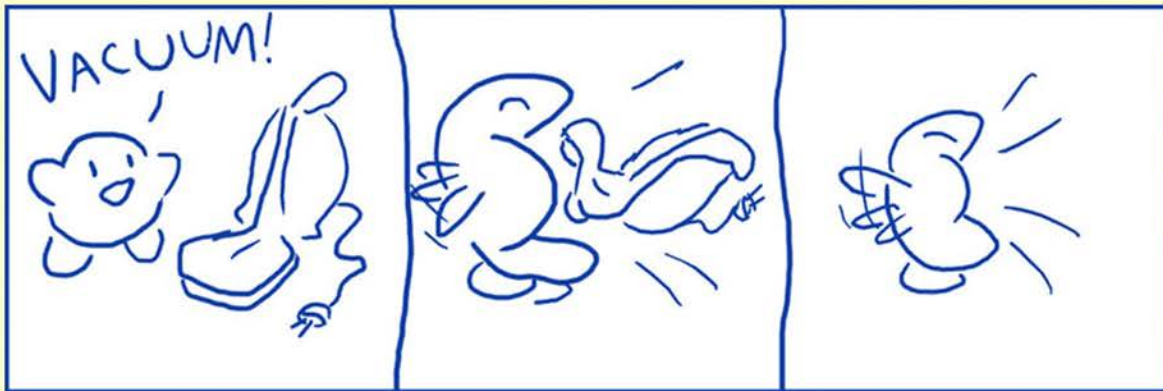
This is the "Kirby eating gag" in its most basic form.

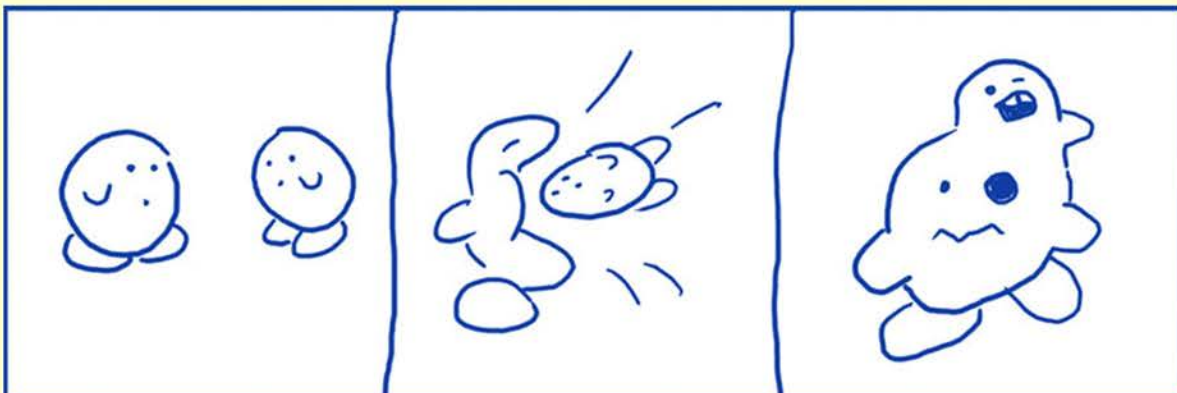

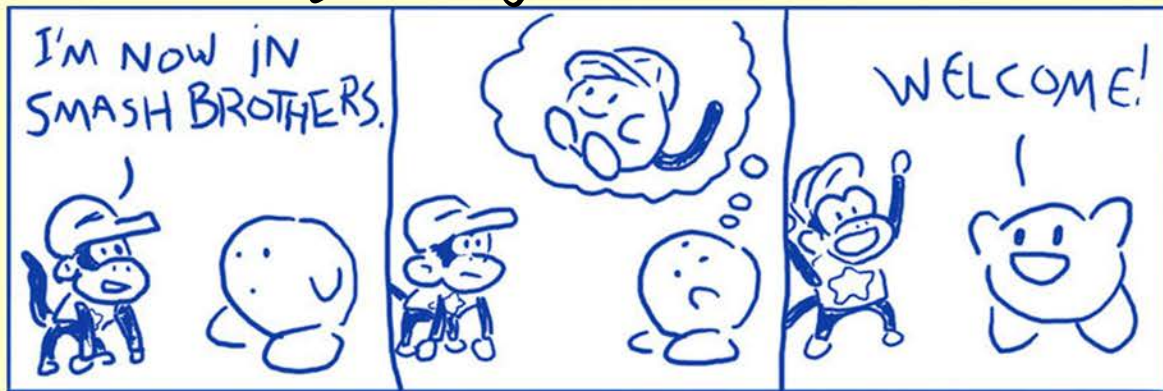


HDF stands for "Highly Detailed Face" and was a character I drew in middle school. This strip is one of the more popular ones with the fans.

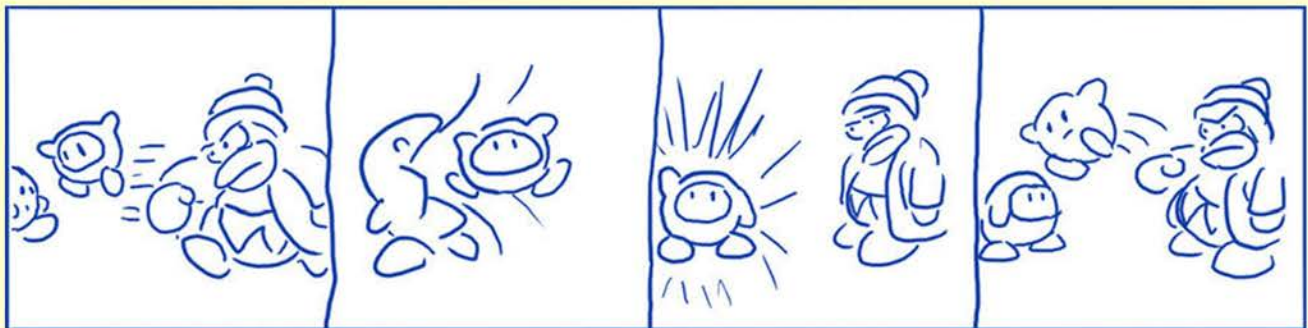

The MAKING of Brawl in the Family

Now that you're familiar with the madness that is Brawl in the Family, you may be wondering how a comic strip jumps from a scattershot collection of ideas into its final, semi-polished form.

Come now, as we take a look behind the brawl.



Step 1: The Sketchbook

Comics almost always begin life on paper, where--while crude--the basic ideas and/or framework of the strip is often constructed. It's all about quickly jotting it down!

There are currently seven sketchbooks filled with BitF-related drawings and early comics! Here's an example straight from one of those hallowed pages.

Loose linework to convey basic posing and emotions

Pretty off-model! But I'm going for speed at this point.

Quick, simple dialogue to establish flow--polishing the script comes later

General lack of detail except for elements crucial to the gag



Step 2: Digital Draft

The second step takes the concept from the sketchbook and tightens the framing and placement. The goal here is to basically have all of the content and ideas presented more or less how they will be in the final version. While the art is still on the loose side, the purpose is to place the characters and text in a close approximation of where they'll end up when the strip hits the website.

In a way, the looser linework in this phase kind of has its own character to it, so I try hard nowadays to carry that look to the finalized version!

Character poses are more detailed

Still pretty loose linework to get the general shapes

Some panel changes to enhance the cohesion and buildup

Dialogue is refined but still open for tweaks

Step 3: Final Linework

The digital sketch stays on its own separate, transparent layer, while I draw the full outlines from scratch using the sketch as a guideline. Since this is the version everyone will see, this is where presentation and polish really matters. A few minor things may be adjusted here or there, while details (and backgrounds where applicable) come into their own in this step.

After doing the basic linework, I finish with the coloring and shading, but that step took a lot less time before I went with a more filled-in style of shading in 2010--a bit after the last comics presented in this book.

So now the strip is ready to hit the internet and future bestselling books!
